## **NHS Demo Saturday 4 March**

Thank you to members who joined the thousands of people from all over country in the NHS rally which was described as one of the biggest in NHS history .The demo was about the future of the NHS and a call to secure the NHS as Austerity in the NHS represents a real risk to the safety of patients and the service.

## **Lambeth Council Budget proposals 2017 / 2018**

On 24 February, the full Cabinet published its 2017/18 budget. Between 2010 and 2018 funding from Central Government will have been cut by as estimated 55%. Over that period the Council will have made £238m of “savings”- read cuts. This includes £55m which will be made over the next three years. Lib Peck, Leader, Lambeth Council, describes this level of ‘savings’ as” delivering on long term issues, driving growth that benefits everyone and building strong communities.’ It’s about reducing inequality and supporting residents that protect those more in need”. The ‘savings will be made to a wide range of local services i.e. Staffing, Adult Social Care, Supporting People , Health, Housing , Children’s Social Care, Neighbourhoods, Environment and Employment , Regeneration, Planning, Corporate Resources , Education, Learning and Skills. It is yet to see whether ‘savings’ across this range of essential services will tackle inequality and support those most in need.
