Libraries

As most members will know by now, Lambeth announced that it would reduce the cost of the service by a quarter while keeping all libraries open for the same hours as now and maintaining the Libraries Home Visit Service fully operational.

Over the past ten years, the service has been progressively streamlined to the point where it is very difficult to see how there could be any scope left for reducing costs or generating significant additional income. The librarians

through their union, UNISON, have nonetheless been talking with the Council in the hope of finding a solution which will be acceptable to library users and staff. After the talks got nowhere, the librarians decided to strike for a day at a time. The first strike was due to take place this Wednesday 2nd July, but the Council have become more reasonable as the strike day approached and the strike has now been postponed until 11th July. We must hope that a satisfactory deal can be done before then and the strike avoided altogether. *Stephen Carlill*

Less Austere

Thanks to tireless campaigning by the National Pensioners Convention and Unite the Union amongst others, the Government has announced that the Winter Fuel Allowance will be paid in full next Winter to everyone of State Pension Age or older. The allowance will be clawed back through the tax system from recipients fortunate enough to have a yearly income of £35,000 or more.

Personal Independence Payments, which are meant to reduce the costs of disabled recipients resulting from their disabilities continue to be argued over. At the time of writing, the Government is promising not to reduce the payments to existing claimants, but to be much more parsimonious with new claimants.

Remembering Ted

Ted Knight will be remembered by many of our members as LAMPAG's inspirational Vice Chair in the years leading up to his death in 2020. An especially fond memory is of him leading us in an occupation of Lambeth Town Hall to prevail on the Council to restore our free use of a room in the Town Hall for our meetings.

To the wider Lambeth community, he will always be remembered as the Leader of the Council who, along with his fellow Labour Councillors, was surcharged and removed from office for defying the Thatcher Government's cuts, which would have impacted the borough's most vulnerable residents.

Ted Knight (1933 – 2020) Socialist, Marxist, Comrade and Friend Leader of Lambeth Council 1978 – 1985 "Workers of the world, unite! We have nothing to lose but our chains!" Ted was acutely aware of the injustices to older people, many of whom suffer poverty and loneliness. He believed strongly in the right of pensioners to dignity, respect, financial security and to have their contributions to society recognised. He was a fierce advocate for involving us in policies, practices and actions which affect our lives.

As well as his role in LAMPAG, Ted was active in the local retired members branch of Unite the Union, the London Region of the National Pensioners Convention and the Croydon Assembly. He was keen to unite not just pensioners but the whole community to combat attacks on their livelihoods and wellbeing.

Inspired by his socialist convictions, Ted was uncompromising in driving real change, whether this was in national campaigns to fight crippling Austerity measures or local campaigns to keep our libraries and children's services. He has left us all with an enduring legacy on which to build.

Boycott advice from Palestine Solidarity Campaign

BUY LOCAL, BUY ALTERNATIVES!

Boycott Israeli produce like avocados, oranges, herbs and dates. When shops in Britain sell Israeli produce, they are profiting from the existence of illegal Israeli settlements on stolen land. Always check the label. If it says "Product of Israel", don't buy it!

Boycott Coca-Cola and its brands: Schweppes, Sprite, Fanta, Innocent, Appletiser, Smart Water and Costa Coffee, Coca-Cola violates international law by operating on stolen Palestinian land. Stop Coca-Cola profiting from the occupation.

Alternative: Gaza Cola, Palestine Cola, Salaam Cola, Karma Drinks Organic Cola, Whole Earth Cola, Green Cola, Fentimans Curiosity Cola.

Coco-Cola are the world's worst plastic polluter, selling 100 billion single-use plastic bottles each year, with many ending up in landfills and the ocean! [Greenpeace]



Sabra hummus and Yarden hummus and dips have recently removed their Israeli origins from their labels! Since coming out of the EU, it is no longer a requirement

for manufacturers to disclose the 'origin' of the food.

Israeli dates are grown on stolen Palestinian land with stolen water – always check the label.

Alternative: Try Palestinian brands like Yaffa or Zaytoun

- 75% of the world's Medjoul dates are produced in Israel.
- UK is Israel's 2nd largest market worth \$24 million in 2023 (4k tons)

Avocados have become one of Israel's most profitable crops and not just in Israel, but also in Morocco.

Sainsbury's, Tesco, M&S, Waitrose, Lidl – they all stock Israels stolen food – make sure you check the label!
