# Breakfast at Noon

Last month's open meeting included a wide-ranging discussion of domiciliary social care. Anne Lawrence is kindly arranging a local speaker on this subject for our February meeting.

A major problem with the current service is that it is provided through numerous private agencies which do not pay the carers for the time they spend travelling between clients. It is not uncommon for a carer to be required to travel half way across London between clients. The first visit of the day is usually to help the client wash and dress, and then give them breakfast. The long journeys mean that some clients are not getting breakfast until 11am or even later.

Paying carers for travel time has been talked about for as long as anyone can remember but nothing has been done. Almost without exception, the carers are immigrants who have not yet found more congenial work. As mentioned in the last newsletter, the Government is choking off the supply of new arrivals for care work. Better use will therefore need to be made of existing carers and steps taken to persuade them to stay on as carers. So, the present may be a good time to campaign for travel time to be paid.

## Annual General Meeting

The AGM will be included in our March meeting. This month and next are the time for members to consider what they can do to enable LAMPAG to carry on as an effective campaigning organisation.

Our existing Chair, Joint Secretaries, Treasurer and Membership Secretary are willing to stay on for another year but would be happy for someone else to take over some or all of their work. # Membership Report

After a few delays, we have now completed the renewal of memberships for the year which commenced in April 2025. We have a total of 60 members. Of these, 34 receive newsletters by post and 26 receive their newsletters as email attachments.

A further ten people had been receiving newsletters by post though they have not been members for a while. By stopping sending them newsletters, we are saving £123 a year.

Age UK Lambeth are very helpful over the newsletters going by post. They allow us to use their photocopier and charge only 3p an A4 side. They also allow us to use their franking machine. Besides being less tedious than sticking stamps on envelopes, this saves us 3p on the postage for each newsletter.

Sending newsletters as email attachments does not cost anything. However, even with Age UK's help, sending newsletters by post is expensive. Assuming an average of seven sides to be copied, each newsletter currently costs £1.12 to send, that is, 21p for copying plus 7p for the envelope and address label, and plus 84p postage. Royal Mail increase the postage in April each year and the increases in recent years have varied between 2p and 10p. So, **if anyone receiving emails by post is content to have them by email in future, please let Gloria Cameron or one of the other officers know.**

He seemed very competent and determined to make the most of Lambeth's limited housing stock. It is therefore disappointing that he will not be a candidate for re-election in the Borough Council election due to take place in May.

The local branch of the Palestine Solidarity Campaign are energetically continuing their efforts to inform the public via street stalls about what is happening in Gaza, the West Bank, East Jerusalem and the Golan, in all of which Palestinians continue to be attacked.

Also, the branch has been picketing Marks & Spencer and Tesco, to encourage shoppers to boycott Israeli produce. Please check the origin whenever you can of avocados, dates and small potatoes.
