A Palestine Primer

Judaism, Jews and Zionism

Judaism is the religion of the Jews. It has diversified into a number of strands over the centuries. As Jews lived to an extent separately from their Christian or Jewish neighbours, even some of those who have no religious faith identify as Jews. In other words, Jews are an ethnic group.

Zionism is a political movement which originated in the nineteenth century. Its core belief is that Jews should not merely live largely separate from other ethnic groups but should have their own country, in which they would be the overwhelming majority of the population. Strictly orthodox Jews abominate Zionism. There is also strong opposition from socialist and other progressive Jews.

The Palestinians

Zionists claim that the entire Jewish population of Palestine was expelled from Palestine when Palestine was part of the Roman Empire. Reputable historians reject the idea that whole populations, rather than elites, were ever exiled. Almost certainly, the Palestinians are mostly descendants of the Jews who remained in Palestine. Subsequently, many converted to Christianity, and of those a majority converted to Islam when Palestine was under Muslim rule. The rulers were tolerant of Jews and Christians but favoured Muslims in various ways, including exemption from taxes!

DNA analyses suggest that European Jews have little, if any, historical connection with anywhere in the Middle East.

The mass murder of Gazans is only the latest stage in a long-running process of ethnic cleansing which began in 1948, when Zionist militias drove three-quarters of a million Palestinians from their homes.
